

CODE OF CONDUCT

In the interests of safety, well-being and social development of the children, we expect all pupils to observe the following Code of Conduct.

General

1. All pupils should wear school uniform.
2. Pupils should be in school and ready to start lessons by 9.00 am.
3. Pupils should show care and consideration for others and their property at all times.
4. Bullying either by physically striking or insensitive name-calling is not permitted.
5. Bad language is unacceptable at all times.
6. Mobile phones or electronic devices should not be brought to school by pupils.
7. Bicycles should not be ridden within the school grounds. Each child must have received a cycle permit before they ride their bike to school. Permits can be obtained from Mr Ball.

Inside School

1. All pupils should enter and leave school through the door shown to them by their teacher at the start of the school year.
2. When moving around school, pupils should be quiet, stay to the left-hand-side and never run in the corridors.
3. Pupils should always stand back and allow visitors/adults through the door first.
4. School equipment should be returned to its proper place after use and left in a tidy manner.
5. All litter and wastepaper should be placed in the appropriate bin provided.
6. Pupils should be silent in School Assembly.

Break and Lunch Time

1. Pupils should remain in their seats while eating their lunch.
2. Pupils should respect the supervisor on duty.
3. All rubbish must be placed in the appropriate bin.
4. Pupils should use the toilets before going out to play.

In the Playground

1. Pupils should obey the directions of the teachers, classroom assistants and supervisory assistants on duty.
2. Pupils should not take food into the playground.
3. Pupils are not permitted to play along the back of the school.
4. Balls should not be used in the playground.
5. Rough or disruptive games are forbidden.
6. When lining up in the playground after the bell rings, pupils should walk to their line and wait silently for their teacher.
